Benjamin Carrión (1897-1979) was a lawyer by the Central University of Ecuador where he was later a teacher and later at the Autonomous University of Mexico. In public service, he served as Minister of Education, legislator, diplomat in various countries and its performance as Consul at Havre (France) enriching forged friendships with Miguel de Unamuno, Gabriela Mistral and other talents of the twentieth century. His greatest work is the creation of the Casa de la Cultura (CCE), a prestigious institution with over 70 years in the service of culture. "If Ecuador can not be a military and economic power, can be instead a cultural power nourished by our richest traditions," he said in life this illustrious visionary writer and he thinks that inspires the work of the CCE with subsidiaries in throughout the country.
